

e University of Scranton was founded as Saint omas College by Most Reverend William G. O'Hara, the rst Bishop of Scranton, who had always hoped to provide an opportunity for higher education in the Lackawanna Valley. In August of 1888, with few resources at hand, he blessed a single block of granite as ngineering, business analytics and speech-language a cornerstone for his new college, which would admit its pathology.

rst students four years later. (e cornerstone of Old Main is preserved in the wall of St. omas Hall located at the corner of Linden Street and Monroe Avenue.)

e college was sta ed by diocesan priests and seminarians until 1896 and then, for one year, by the Xaverian Brothers. From 1897 until 1942 the school, which was renamed e University of Scranton in 1938, was administered for the Diocese by the Christian Brothers. In the late summer of 1942, at the invitation of Hall and Montrone Hall. Bishop William Hafey, 19 Jesuits, including the University's rst Jesuit President, Rev. Coleman Nevils, Jr. Hall, which houses the departments of Physical S.J., arrived on campus to administer the University.

e University commissioned the ten heraldic banners carried in the academic procession to celebrate the 450th anniversary of the founding of the rst Jesuit college in Messina, Sicily (1548), and the 110th anniversary of the founding of Saint omas College (1888), the precursor of e University of Scranton.

- (e banner adorned with the seal of the Society of Jesus (IHS, surmounted with a cross above three nails and surrounded with a halo of rays) announces that e University of Scranton is a Jesuit university.
- (e banner adorned with the seal of the family of Saint Ignatius Loyola (a golden pot suspended between two wolves) bears witness to the fact that the University's educational philosophy is derived from the thought of Saint Ignatius (1491-1556), the founder of the Society of Jesus.
- (e banner adorned with the seal of the Diocese of Scranton (a star rising between two crossed keys) recalls and celebrates the fact that the University was founded by the Most Reverend William O'Hara, D.D., the rst Bishop of Scranton.
- (e banner adorned with the seal of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (the vepointed star) honors the Christian Brothers' half century of devoted service to the students of Saint omas College and e University of Scranton.
- (e banner adorned with a device drawn from the seal of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the stack of wheat) both identi es the University's location and proclaims its special mission to the citizens of Pennsylvania.
- (e banner adorned with the iconic symbol of Saint omas Aquinas (the radiant sunburst) recalls both the name of the University's precursor college (Saint omas College) and announces that Saint omas remains the heavenly patron of the University.
- (e banner adorned with the crown refers to the nickname of the University's athletic
