In support of this commitment and in compliance with the Drug Free Schools and Communi on the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1988, the informa on provided herein is designed to ensure that community members are aware of University alcohol and drug policies and applicable aws, health risks associated with substance buse, and available resources.

- 1. Standardsof Conduct.In accordance with federal, state, and local laws, the unlawful manufacture, distribu Ön, dispensing possession use of a controlled substance and/or illegaluse of alcoholby students on University property or at University sponsored unc Önsis strictly prohibited. Policies for Employees:

Alcoholand Chemica Substance Abuse

A. Useof alcoholby those under the ageof 21 and/or the possession useor the distribu on of illicit drugsby Universityemployeeswill not be tolerated. Employees of the University who violate these regula ons will be dealt with by the appropriate supervisor of 8ce responsible or that individual or group in accordance with the University's disciplinary policies and guidelines Drugabuse and dependency is a na onal social and health problem, with devastating consequence to individuals, their friends, and families. The University of Scrantonis concerned about the adversedects of drugabuse on employee job performance, health, safety, and security. An Employee Assistance Program is available to all employee and may be a resource for employees who feel they have a drug or alcohol dependency. - E.Will require each academico 8cer, supervisoror student employmento 8cial havingknowledgeof or receivingno YPca Yon of a convic Yon as described above to immediately no YPy in wri Yng to the Vice President for Human Resources Undercertain condi Yons the Vice President for Human Resources will no YPy the appropriate academico 8cial.

- H. Will make a goodfaith e +ort to con Yhue to maintain a drug free workplacethrough implement a Yon of this policy.
 - 1. Applica ion of Policy. The Drug Free Workplace Policy, which applies to all persons in the University workplace, is supported by a drug awareness program available to the faculty, sta + and students of the University. § 6307. Misrepresentation of Ageto SecurdLiquoror Malt or BrewedBeverages

x A personis guilty of a summaryo +ensefor a Þrst viola Ÿon and a misdemeano of the third degree for any subsequent viola Ÿonsif he/she is under the age of 21 and knowingly and falsely represents him/herself to be 21 years of age or older, for the purpose of obtaining any liquor or malt or brewed beverages Maximum Þne is \$500 plus court costs.

§ 6309. Represening that Minor is of Age

x A personis guilty of a misdemeanor the third degree if he/sheknowingly, willfully, and falsely represents to any licensed dealer, or other person, that a minor is of legalage for the purpose of inducing a person to sell or furnish any liquor, malt or brewed beverage to the minor. The minimum penalty is a Pne of not less than \$300.

x A minor (under 21 years of age) shall not drive, operate or be in physical control of a motor vehicle while having alcoholin their system. This is a summary offense with a fine of \$100

$\S\,3802. Driving Under In {\tt Suence} of Alcoholor Controlled {\tt Substance}.$

x An individual shall not drive, operate or be in actual physical control of the movement of a vehicle such that the individual is rendered in capable of safely driving, operating or being in actual physical control of the movement of the vehicle, or the individual is under the influence of a drug or combination of drugs to a degree which impairs the individual is ability to safely drive, operate or be in actual physical control of the movement of the vehicle. For an individual who is 21 years of age or older, the Blood Alcohol Content is .08%, for a minor under 21, the Blood Alcohol Content is .02%. The minimum penalty for the first offense for those under 21 is a \$500 \$5,000 fine, jail time of 48 hours to six months, a license suspension of 12 months and parental notification.

x The Act prohibits, amongother things, the manufacture, distribution, saleor acquisition by misrepresentation forgery of controlled substance exceptin accordance with the Act, as well as the knowing possession for controlled substance sunlawfully acquired. Penalties for first time violators range from 30 days imprisonment, a \$500 fine or both for possession or distribution of a small amount of marijuana or hashis mot for sale, to 15 years imprisonment or a \$250,000 fine or both for the manufacture or delivery of a Schedule or II narcotic. Fine sand terms of imprisonment may be doubled under certain circumstance sincluding the distribution of a controlled substance o a person under 18 years of ageor a conviction for a secondor subsequent of fense. x Thepenaltyfor simplepossession a controlled substances up to one year imprisonmentanda minimum fine of at least\$1,000 or both. A second conviction carries of penalty of a minimum 15 days imprisonment, not to exceed years, and fine of at least\$2,500. Two or more prior drug convictions will result in at least\$0 days imprisonment, not to exceed years, and fine of at least\$5,000.
